





- Superfast Broadband becoming an 'essential' for business and life
- Government has made £530 million available across the UK for Broadband infrastructure.
- BD UK fund recognises that commercial providers will not deliver in many rural communities
- Funding has to be matched £ for £ by local contributions which will be a real challenge


Derbyshire County Council



- £40m £80m estimates for full coverage across Derbyshire
- 188,000 households, 469,000 people, 40.1% of population in 'white' areas in Derbyshire.
- £7.4m BD UK allocation for the county.
- Is it enough? Can we match fund it? Can it be managed?

- Stimulating local interest/demand to create the commercial case
- Developing a realistic delivery plan as a basis for accessing the BD UK cash
- Approaching the 'white' areas in a phased way – by town, village, industrial estate
- Identifying possible sources of match funding
- ERDF, LEP, RGF, Infrastructure levy, New Homes Bonus, Community gap funding
