





Background of Report




- Increasing population of older people
- Disproportionate rise in people aged 85+
- Public spending challenge "if care costs simply increase with population they could nearly double by 2026"


Derbyshire's Older Population



- Current population aged 65+ 137700
- 20% rise by 2015 (27200)
- 63% rise by 2030 (86300)
- 118% rise in people aged 85+ by 2030 (21500)




People Aged 65 Plus in Derbyshire Projections 2009-2030



- 20% (27,200) rise in numbers of older people 2009-15
- 63% rise by 2030 (86,300)

Projections 2009-2030




- 44% (32,700) rise in numbers of 65 74 age range
- 69% (32,100) increase in numbers of 75 -84 year olds
- 118% (21,500) more people aged 85 plus

General Messages for Partnership




- Challenge can be most effectively met by working across organisations to promote ageing well


