LSP survey – evidence re outcomes

- Outcomes: 90% of respondents felt there were examples of initiatives benefitting local people that would not have happened without the LSPs
- 84% of respondents strongly agreed that the benefits of LSPs outweigh their costs in time, energy and benefit
- 90% reported progress on delivering services to better meet community needs
- 98% reported a better understanding of local partners' priorities
- 76% progress in narrowing the gaps between the most and least deprived

Room for improvement related to costs and efficiency..

- 44% felt made no progress in pooling/aligning budgets
- 38% not made efficiency gains by improving procurement
- 36% little progress made on reducing costs and bureaucracy

LSP Survey – views on LAA

The introduction of LAAs was perceived to have had a positive impact on LSPs.

Over 85% of top tier LSPs felt the LAA had:

- made the role of the LSP more important
- added value to the Sustainable Community Strategy
- improved partnership working
- led to stronger performance management.
