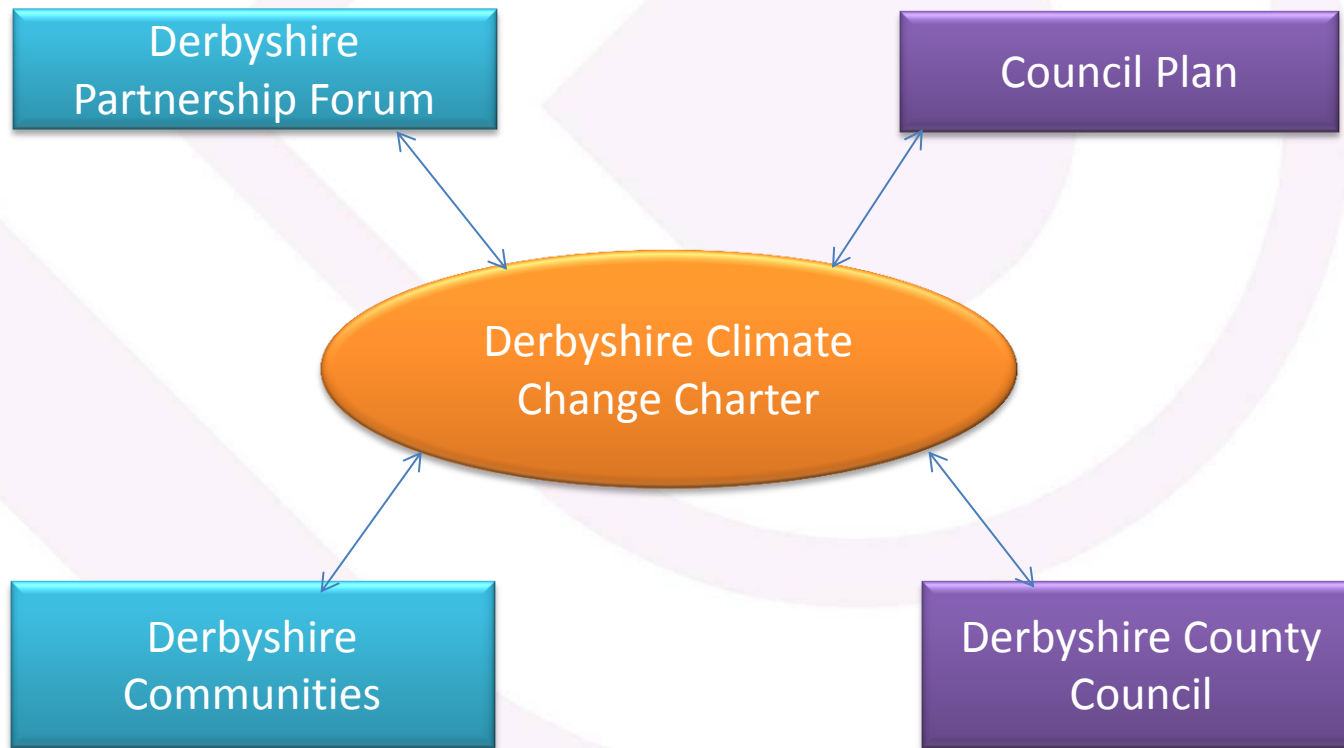

**Section 4:** Further details and information on Derbyshire based climate change strategies and policies, linking to other bodies who provide advice and guidance on Climate Change (Climate Local Initiative).

# Consultation

- Consultation work has been carried out through the summer.
- Community group focus events were carried out in May and several local and active community groups took part in helping to shape the document.
- Consultation with The Derbyshire Partnership Forum Climate Change Group members was carried out over the summer.
- Internal consultation with departments via the Environmental Sustainability Group.



## Next Steps

- Full Cabinet approval and adoption of the Charter will be sought in Autumn
- Following approval the Derbyshire Partnership Forum Climate Change Group members will seek adoption within their own authority.
- The DPF Climate Change Group members will develop an action plan based on the six key priority areas to drive forward mitigation and adaptation action across Derbyshire.
- Derbyshire County Council proposes to sign up to Climate Local on behalf of all authorities across Derbyshire and use the Climate Change Charter and Action Plan as the basis for reporting and monitoring.
- The Charter and its action plan will be managed by the DPF Climate Change Group via quarterly meetings. The full document will be reviewed every 5 years.
