Moors for the Future

Chris Dean, project manager for Moors for the future gave a presentation on Landscape scale blanket bog restoration, science and communications taking place across the Peak District National Park and South Pennine Moorlands. It was highlighted that DCC no longer provide funding of £20k for this project.

WB agreed to investigate what had happened to the funding and suggested that this presentation be shown at the next full DPF board meeting with a view to finding alternative funding to fill the gap. Climate Change Charter

AW gave a brief update on the Action Plan. Final version of the plan will be circulated by mid/end May with a view to seeking cabinet approval in June. We will also seek to approve signing to Climate Local and use the Action plan to report back to climate local ambitions.

APSE update

A cabinet paper was approved on the 5th May to take forward 5 potential sites for further formal investigation including planning and procurement procedures. Climate Just

AW highlighted this new web based tool .Climate Just is an information tool designed to help with the delivery of equitable responses to climate change at the local level. Its main focus is to assist the development of socially just responses to the impacts of extreme events, such as flooding and heatwaves, as well as supporting wider climate change adaptation. It also includes issues related to fuel poverty and carbon emissions. The website contains new data resources and collates existing

data and information into user-friendly summaries and guidance. It includes:

- Information on why socially just responses are important and relevant
- Evidence summaries explaining who is socially vulnerable and which places are disadvantaged with respect to different climate change impacts and why
- New map data showing where extreme events like floods and heat waves are likely to have the biggest impacts as a result of the characteristics of people and communities
- Information about how communities may experience further disadvantage through policy, such as through the effects of energy and carbon reduction measures on fuel poverty
- Suggestions for local decision-makers on what to do to respond and how to start taking action
- Case studies to show what others have done and how they have done it
- Signposting to other tools and resources to help with sourcing additional evidence and materials to support action.
