Community cohesion projects

The newly launched Bringing People Together Fund helps improve community cohesion in Derbyshire. Local community groups can apply

for grants between £100 to £2000 to fund activities that bring different groups of people together. So far, £10,747 of funding has been granted to seven groups in Derbyshire. There is still plenty of time for local community aimed at bringing groups to obtain funding for their project as the closing date for applications is 16 July 2010. Some projects coincide with the Bringing People Together Campaign 11 April to 23 May 2010. In support of the campaign, a Bringing People Together Calendar will be made available to members of the public. Partners and local organisations can submit information on projects encouraging community cohesion and they will be added to the calendar. Responding to the Economic Downturn

The current slot in the targeted timetable is given over to promote projects responding to the economic downturn. This has been a key priority for the partnership over the last year and many projects have taken place. Local businesses have been supported to grow, and we have supported people to get back in to employment. The county council's Near-Buy, Shop

Local campaign encourages people to shop local and supports traders. Changes have also been made to make it easier for local firms to win county council business. These projects, along with Derbyshire Economic Partnership's (DEP) Market Towns Initiative, help to support businesses and individuals through challenging times.

Derbyshire is currently performing

better than the rest of the region in terms of businesses showing economic growth. However, challenges still remain because of the rise in the number of people out of work.

Supporting people to get back in to work is a key objective of the Access Alliance Programme, which is supported by DEP. One of the main priorities of the programme is to provide training to those out of work to improve their chances of getting a job. The programme

As a result of the Near-Buy, Shop Local Campaign, a business fair in Clowne, run by Clowne Enterprise has recently been launched. The fair in March was attended by 40 local businesses who promoted local produce and services. Businesses attending the fair

picked up new customers from the event and improved local



also promotes affordable transport to people who struggle to meet these costs to access employment or training. By the end of 2010, the programme is expected to have delivered 35 new jobs, assisted 1500 people in improving their skills, as well as having helped 574 people in accessing employment. Engaging with the third sector

Support is at hand for third sector groups and agencies engaging with them. 3D - Third Sector Support for Derbyshire is a county wide partnership of organisations that offer infrastructure support to frontline third sector groups. They offer a range of training and skills development as well as one to one help with all aspects of running a third sector organisation such as

employment, financial and legal advice.

The Voice for the VCS Project works with 3D to improve voluntary sector engagement with Local Strategic Partnerships and the Local Area Agreement (LAA). Over 5000 groups and organisations in Derbyshire play a vital role in delivering a wide range of services. Training sessions have helped voluntary organisations understand the LAA and how they contribute to achieving the priorities set out in it.

The Voice for the VCS welcomes the opportunity to work more closely with statutory partners, and to build mutual understanding between the sectors. They offer free, bespoke training opportunities for staff and management teams of any Partnership Forum member. Training sessions will highlight the contribution of the third sector to partnership priorities and support delivery of NI7, creating 'an environment for a thriving third sector'. Safeguarding Training

Training is available to support the partnership's safeguarding agenda and efforts are being coordinated amongst key statutory agencies to help partners deal with safeguarding issues. The projects aim to reduce the number of people in



vulnerable positions and train partners to identify and help those considered to be at risk.
