	CS has met with secondary schools in the urban core area to discuss town centre ASB. McDonald's restaurant has been closed for refurbishment. McDonald's will have security staff and CCTV in the future. No further reports of ASB in town centre were raised. CS explained that ASB statistics do go down in the town centre over the summer as young people migrate to the parks. DCC Youth Workers continue to provide outreach youth work in the area.

	ME shared information with the LCP about the Early Help review.	
4:0	Priority updates including sharing of priority plans	
	Emotional Health and Wellbeing (lan Stevens)	
	IS explained that the new plan for 2018-2019 is currently being developed. IS discussed the plan and actions agreed from the Young Person's Health Group.	

Following IS' presentation at the last LCP meeting, IS explained that the outstanding action regarding feedback from online internet safety Key Stage 2 has been completed. Previously, IS discussed 'Escape' - IS explained that there has been an increase in Primary School input into the YP's Health Group and Primary Schools have identified 'internet safety' as a priority. The 'Escape' performance by 'Salt Mine' productions aims to raise awareness around CSE to KS 2 children. The 'Escape' performance was offered to all 51 KS 2 provision in South Derbyshire/ South Dales. 10 schools elected to take part.

IS also discussed **Working for Marcus**' and the plan to complete targeted group work with young people with a production called 'Working for Marcus' for all secondary schools across South Derbyshire and South Dales. The 'Working for Marcus' CSE prevention and awareness programme by Loudmouth Education and Training, includes YP's sessions and pre and post-performance lesson plans. IS updated the LCP and explained that there had now been 10 performances in secondary schools and 1,781 KS 2 pupils have viewed the play. Feedback from pupils and teachers has been unanimously good.

IS explained that this year, the priority is Public Health Funding or 'Holistic Health Funding' for Tier 2 substance misuse. The Young Person's Health Group discussed outcomes for funding and using it to acquire an additional resource. IS explained that this needs to be additional Tier 2 work. IS has spoken with Pingle and Granville schools regarding how we can meet outcomes. It was agreed that DCC would employ an additional specialised Tier 2 drugs worker. The vacancy is awaiting approval and is expected to run from 4th September until the end of this financial year. It is not known whether the funding will be renewed for next year. ME explained that there are changes to Holistic Funding streams. It was identified that this is an ambitious plan and funding runs from the financial year. Concerns were raised by the LCP around sustainability.

IS advised that the next Young Person's Health Group meeting is scheduled for 16th July when the group will write this year's plan. IS advised the LCP that this year's plan is still a work in progress and input to develop the Children's Health Group Plan is through the Young Person's Health Group. LCP members are encouraged to attend on 16th July.

Priority Leads

PL stressed the importance of looking at gaps and how we can fill them. PL advised that the Priority Lead for CSE and Substance Misuse was previously Mary Hague. IS advised that the Young Person's Health Group has been active in South Derbyshire for a number of year. IS has had a conversation with Trident Reach to avoid duplication of meetings. PL discussed the idea to maintain separate Leads and have one meeting with three separate plans to identify specific interventions around priorities. The LCP discussed 'Children at Risk of Exploitation' including drugs and CSE. PL discussed a proposal by

Shelley Cooper regarding the Vulnerable Young Person's Panel and 'Children at Risk of Exploitation'. Shelley will take the lead at these meetings and feed back trends to the LCP. Chris Milner has offered to assist with performance data and PL explained that the DCC customer segmentation team can assist with data to measure impact. LCP members have requested police representation for exploitation. IS explained that he would be meeting with Trident Reach in July.

NEXT AGENDA ITEM - It was agreed that the LCP would re-look at priority updates in the Autumn.

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PL requested that LCP members from secondary schools provide details of their offer with regards to Emotional Wellbeing at the next meeting. KG explained that Dawn Wain, CAMHS had produced a draft pathway which describes the role of different professionals.

Targeted Family Support (Victoria Lee)

At the last LCP Meeting, PL asked if any LCP members would like to offer support for Targeted Family Support. Vicky Lee explained that she had not received any response to date. VL has spoken to 2 primary schools who have agreed to come on board. VL is in the process of contacting secondary schools. VL is awaiting a reply from Home Start.

AD and TB discussed 0-5 agenda and School Readiness and explained that the working group meeting with representatives from health, early years settings and schools was held last week. AD confirmed that invitations have been sent to schools. The working group discussed reception questionnaires towards the end of the year and a questionnaire centred on the 10 keys. PL asked AD to consider how to engage Primary Schools in this agenda. AD explained that the working group are looking at working with the voluntary sector.

AD discussed a DRAFT plan entitled 'Little Acorns to Mighty Oaks', looking at 0-5 services in SDSD that support readiness for school. The 10 steps are contacts where parents/ carers are offered support and information with Early Years Services in the child's crucial early years to develop the prime areas of learning, particularly communication and language, personal, social and emotional development and physical development.

Aspiration (Shaun Woodcock) – update from Chris Smith

Shaun Woodcock explained that he manages the RISE project for raising aspirations in South Derbyshire. SW is looking at raising aspirations in the wider community, particularly in the urban core. SW discussed the RISE awards event last week and the importance of recognition. Three students from Pingle School sang at the event.

SW has been looking at Social Mobility and has approached the university with regards to the students researching and conducting a project in South Derbyshire which looks at why South Derbyshire scores consistently low on social mobility, as financial deprivation is not significantly high in this area and it is thought that local people might be lacking in confidence. This is a fact finding exercise. SW is looking to engage people who can inspire others, particularly young people. Deborah Haywood is an ambassador for the project.

5:0 STP and Social Mobility – Michelle Skinner, CEO, SDCVS and The Children's Agenda and the Place Alliance and how GPs/CCG/ Health might be better represented at Children's LPG – Jo Finnegan, Place Lead for SD

JF discussed the Derbyshire Sustainability and Transformation Partnership (STP), better known as Joined Up Care Derbyshire, and how interventions are delivered at Place. STP has clear aims about the future of delivery of health and care in Derby and Derbyshire. See https://joinedupcarederbyshire.co.uk/ for more information. The principle of increasing individuals' ability to self-care, and enabling more care to be provided in the community (in geographical "places") is established, in common with the Derbyshire wedge (See handout). Place was established 2 years ago.

The original 21 "places" were built on the registered lists of groups of GP practices in largely existing footprints, but it has become clear over time that there were too many such places for larger organisations to engage effectively with; notably county-wide NHS Providers and DCC. With this in mind the STP Place board has recommended the development of "Place Alliance" groups which aggregate up the previous places, which are now more contiguous with the Borough/District council areas. This has since been ratified by the STP Executive Board.

Place Alliance group priorities include Derbyshire wide projects – enhanced health in care homes, frailty, falls, continence, delirium and end of life. JF is linking with Vicky Smyth and looking at priorities.
